Anytown Leadership Camp is the premier diversity, leadership and social-justice program in Arizona – empowering youth to become change-agents in their schools and in their communities.

Anytown is a nationally recognized, award winning leadership and social justice program for youth ages 14-19 that brings together a diverse group of students from high schools across the region for a weeklong residential experience


Through interactive workshops, discussions and games delegates explore topics like prejudice, discrimination, and bias. Delegates create a model for an ideal community based on respect, understanding, and inclusivity, in which members not just tolerate, but celebrate each other's differences.

Students learn about issues related to racism, sexism, homophobia, classism, and other injustices that affect their lives and learn appropriate and effective methods of discussing difficult topics, such as differences of race, ethnicity, religion, gender, orientation, socio-economic status, and other social identifiers.

Teens who experience Anytown Leadership Camp leave the program equipped with the tools to increase their ability to foster inclusion and respect among all members of society.

MISSION AND VISION


As a leading catalyst and facilitator of community change, Anytown Leadership Camp provides youth leadership development while embracing and celebrating a diverse society.




ROOTED IN HISTORY

In 1927, leaders from different faiths refused to be bystanders in the face of hatred, intolerance, bigotry, fear and deeply embedded prejudice. At this time, the Ku Klux Klan was active in most areas across the country, directing vicious bigotry towards Catholics, Jews, blacks and "foreigners."

Acknowledging the need for action, leaders including Teddy Roosevelt, Benjamin Cardozo, Jane Addams, and U.S. Supreme Court Chief Justice Charles Evans Hughes, created The National Conference for Christians and Jews – NCCJ. They mobilized citizens against the forces of violence, ignorance and exclusion, and contributed significantly to an expanded definition of "who is an American."





These leaders dedicated the organization to bringing diverse people together to address interfaith divisions. In the 1950s, the NCCJ began its award-winning residential youth leadership institute, the ANYTOWN program and Anytown was born in Arizona.

Several years later (1990's) NCCJ changed their name to the National Conference for Community & Justice and expanded its work to include all issues of social justice, including race, class, gender equity, sexual orientation and the rights of people with different abilities.

As Arizona's oldest human relations organization, Anytown Leadership Camp was born out of the belief that respectful dialogue between people from different backgrounds can bring about positive changes in our communities.



RACE


Anytown Leadership Program 2019 was a fairly diverse group; about 50% of delegates identified as white with significant representation of Hispanic/Latino/a students. We are working to further increase diversity and representation in 2020

GENDER


98% of participants self-identified as either male or female, with over half of the participant identifying as female. We are also seeing significant increases in transgender and gender-expansive/ gender non-binary students in our programs.



DEMOGRAPHICS

FAITH/ RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION

Anytown Leadership Program 2019 had 8 faith groups represented this year. No students selfidentified as Hindu, Sikh, Jewish, Buddhist or Pagan this year. We are working to further increase faith representation in 2020



SEXUAL ORIENTATION

The Anytown delegate application did not ask students to self-report on sexual orientation in 2019, however, we are also seeing significant increases in Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Queer+ students in our programs, allowing for rich conversations about sexual orientation.

DISABILITY (PHYSICAL, EMOTIONAL AND/OR LEARNING)

Agnostic

Self-reported disabilities included: ADHD, Anxiety, Depression, Learning Disabilities, PTSD and various physical abilities. Anytown Leadership camp is ADA accessible. Anytown recognizes mental health stigma exists "and may deter" students from self-reporting. Anytown staffs Mental Health Professionals at each camp available 24/7 to students to check-in with and a Medical Professional who distributes medication and handles medical needs confidentially.

When I left Anytown, my family noticed a considerable shift in my confidence and happiness.

Before Anytown, I struggled a lot with anxiety.

Before Anytown I struggled a lot with anxiety. In ninth grade, I didn't make a single new friend the entire school year because I was so consumed with the fear of being judged and fear - in general. I spent most of the time sitting in the back of the class or alone in the hallways at lunch. That is, until Frankie* came.

I first met Frankie in seventh grade but because Frankie was in foster care, we didn't go to the same eighth or ninth grade. My mom decided to fill out the necessary forms and paperwork to become a foster parent and foster Frankie herself. This all happened in March of 2018. The rest of ninth grade was spent with Frankie and only Frankie. I think a part of me thought that having Frankie as my friend meant I was somehow cured of my anxiety when in actuality - she was my crutch. Tenth grade was almost a remake of ninth grade until enrolled in my 7th period "Foundations of Leadership" class. Much like Anytown, the class creates a safe environment to feel vulnerable and validated in that vulnerability. The class was a family for me.

I first heard about Anytown from the class; which was inevitable when the teacher was also a Director at camp. A few people in the class had gone to Anytown Leadership Camp as student delegates and encouraged me daily to apply. The way they described Anytown sounded too-good-to-be-true. But I applied nonetheless, right before the

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deadline. However, just because I applied during the beginning of summer, didn't mean I didn't have the excitement of going to Anytown stuck in my brain early-on in the .year.

In March of 2019, my family got evicted from our apartment and sudden stress and displacement might have been too much for Frankie because she was moved into a relatives house around April. The move only heightened my anxiety and the first time I actually felt excited for something wasn't until a week before Anytown.



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Anytown was everything I hoped and dreamed of. The programs helped to create further understanding of concepts I knew little about. I learned about allyship and what it really means to be an ally. I strengthened bonds with friends I had lost touch with in April and May. I even gained a lot more self-esteem. When I left Anytown, my family noticed a considerable shift in my confidence and happiness.



I started hanging out with friends, many of whom also went to Anytown. When school started, I had a different outlook on myself and others. Anytown created a support system so strong that after two years, I finally felt comfortable coming out to my dad.

Anytown showed me that trying to make a difference isn't always as daunting as it may seem. Going to Ambassador meetings and discussing ways to spread what we know makes me feel like changing the world is possible.

I guess it's not a surprise when I say I recommend Anytown to <u>everyone</u> I know. Anytown isn't a camp for specific people and you don't need to know anything about social justice to attend. The only tools anyone really needs for Anytown is an open mind... and also a water bottle (hydrate or diedrate!). I will continue to support and fight for the ideals I learned up the mountain, and I thank everyone who encouraged me to go to Anytown, I don't know who I'd be without it.

We are continuing to serve as a catalyst for change!

Anytown Leadership Program 2019 was a success! We have once again received positive feedback about the impact that this experience provides not only to the student delegates but to the community at large. Delegates, staff and parents reported visible changes in attitudes about people and identities who are different from them, gaining confidence and learning skills on how to advocate for themselves and others.

Anytown Leadership Program continues to transform youth, by providing them with the knowledge and skills to question the world around them in a positive manner.

After spending a week at Anytown,

delegates now have a multitude of ideas about how to make changes in their communities. They are aware that they will not be able to tackle everything at the same time, so they are working in conjunction with Anytown at ongoing meetings, trainings & events that support their short- and long-term goals.

For them, Anytown is the catalyst for bringing new possibilities. The process begins with self-awareness and questioning own biases without judgement; from there students move to speaking up when witnessing oppression; to the final step when they start action groups, join clubs and continue their advocacy in the community.

We had **6,550** volunteer hours logged by Anytown Alumni and community members in 2019;

 with varying social identities
 including but not limited to ability,
 age, class, ethnicity, gender-identity
 race, religion, sex and sexual
 orientation.
- Participants in Anytown Leadership Program will learn communication and listening skills necessary to engage in dialogue across differences.
- Participants in Anytown Leadership Program will cultivate critical thinking skills.
- Participants in Anytown Leadership Program will create an interdependent community.
- Participants in Anytown Leadership Program will be empowered to effect change on both a micro and macro level.

All of these objectives will be facilitated through interactive workshops, activities, and large and small group dialogues. And - be measured through pre-surveys, exit surveys, post-camp surveys, interviews and staff debriefing.


